Dear Premier Ford and Minister Calandra:

RE: Ontario Municipal Employees Retirement System – Proposed Governance Review

I write this letter on behalf of the more than 4,800 members and board of directors of the City of Toronto Administrative, Professional, Supervisory Association (COTAPSA). COTAPSA has been in existence since 1967 and is the oldest and largest Municipal Management Association in Canada. We are a registered not-for-profit organization representing the non-union and Management employees of the City of Toronto.

Our mission is to represent our members' interests, including as relating to their mandatory enrollment in the OMERS pension plan as a condition of their employment in the municipal sector. We therefore wish to <u>register our very strong support</u> for what we understand to be your government's commitment to hold a formal OMERS governance review.

We applaud your wise decision. We hope, in due time, to have the opportunity to meet with and present a formal submission to the individual you will designate to lead the review; we also hope to see the reviewer's findings and recommendations published online in full, for dissemination to OMERS stakeholders.

Our chief concerns with OMERS governance are as follows:

We are concerned that the OMERS Act has enabled our pension plan to adopt a governance model compromised by undue complexity and expense. Instituted in 2006, the OMERS bicameral model has weakened board accountability and diminished decision-making transparency at OMERS, while costing millions of dollars of plan members' money. This needs to change.

2) According to OMERS own latest membership affiliation disclosures for calendar year 2023, our COTAPSA members are just one component of the more than **24%** of OMERS active membership referred to as "management/non-union" members.

These OMERS members have <u>no</u> direct representation on OMERS two boards of directors. These members are, according to the same OMERS document, also responsible for nearly 29%² of estimated total member contributions to the plan.

This unfair situation must be also changed. That is why COTAPSA has vigorously advocated for a more inclusive approach to OMERS governance, ideally through a "committee" of employers and members.

3) We have for several years highlighted OMERS limited financial disclosures and the difficulty this creates for OMERS members, sponsors and stakeholders who seek to understand whether, for example, the plan is doing everything it can to reasonably minimize investment and administration expenses. We continue to believe improved disclosures will help the plan achieve greater efficiency in these areas.

Since 2016, we have regularly published our correspondence with the OMERS Sponsors Corporation and OMERS Administration Corporation regarding our members' dissatisfaction with the plan's governance model. We encourage your staff to review this archive for the unique insights it provides.

Again, you have COTAPSA's full and unreserved thanks for committing to a review of OMERS governance practices. We look forward to sharing our views with the reviewer, and to an open and fair discussion of our concerns and of the concerns of our fellow OMERS stakeholders.
